

## Exam instructions

After registering on ESSE3, students will be contacted via ESSE3 for identification 4 days before the date of the exam at 10.00 am. In case the day coincides with a Saturday or Sunday, what counts is the day before Saturday.

Since the exam may take place in different days, starting from day one, students may be alphabetically grouped. If students do not show up the day of the identification, he\she won't be admitted to the exam.

In case exam dates overlap, students must select one of those alternative dates proposed by the lecture **during the day of the identification**. If students do not show up on the assigned date for the exam, he/she won't be able to take the exam.

As for the day of the exam, students must show up via Microsoft Teams **at least 15 minutes before** the scheduled exam starts for identification, bearing their identity card or university booklet. Students must remain connected throughout the exam, and do everything possible to ensure that the connection is stable and remains so, in audio and video. It is highly recommended that there are no other people connected around the student's room.

Before starting the exam, the committee reserves the right to check on the student's room and workstation, which must be only equipped with a personal computer, blank papers (which are to be shown to committee), a pen and a calculator.

The use of material or books is strictly prohibited.

In case of interruption of connection, the committee will reserve the right to evaluate whether the student can be partially assessed or he\she can retake the exam.

During the exam, students are not allowed to make any recording, or leave the workstation, **under the penalty of exclusion from the exam**. Students must remain connected in audio and video until the end of the exam.

According to the general guide, other students or connected auditors are recommended to temporarily turn off the video camera and the audio, as to not disturb the examining student.

For the exam to take place, the lecture will create a class with a **code/link that will be published on ESSE3** the day of the identification, that is **4 days before the exam**.

## Assessment

The assessment consists of two parts:

- a) Oral exam based on two questions in the form of exercises.
- b) A report of 2000 words to be defended during the exam.

The exam will start with the defence of the report, and then the student will be asked to solve two questions-exercises. Explanation of the solutions are required. In case there is a need, student will be shown tables of statistical distributions.

The report must be sent 4 days (96 hours) before the date of the exam. In case the day coincides with a Saturday or Sunday, what counts is the day before Saturday. **The students must use their institutional email address (...@univaq.it) to send their report, otherwise the report will not be considered for the examination, with preclusions of undertaking the exam.**

The report must be sent along with Matlab code and data. The subject of the email must contain the title of the course, the word “report”, the name and surname of the student, and his\her ID number. If students fail to pass the exam, they will be asked to write a new report for the next attempt.
